## Camping Information

### about the campground

The campground is open for reservable stays from Memorial Day weekend through Columbus Day weekend.

### facilities, services, and amenities

A camp store, canoe rentals, coin-operated showers, laundry facilities, dump station, ice, and firewood are available.

### activities

Campers enjoy hiking, biking, swimming, and fishing.

### about the policies

- ◆ Campers with a reservation must register at the campground office between 1 pm and 8 pm. Check-out time is 11 am.
- ◆ Payment due upon registration may be made by cash, voucher, money order, Mastercard, Visa, or Discover.
- ◆ Visitors are required to pay the day-use fee and may visit in the campground during posted visitor hours.
- ◆ Quiet hours are from 10 pm to 7 am.
- ◆ Pets are permitted in the campground only. They must be leashed and attended to at all times.
- ◆ Pets and RVs are not permitted in youth group areas.
- ◆ Do not wash dishes in the sinks or at water stations. Do not brush teeth at the outdoor water stations.
- ◆ Cutting standing trees and shrubs and using power saws is prohibited.
- ◆ After checking out, campers are welcome to spend the rest of the day in the day-use area of the park.

**Attention! Firewood is a major carrier of exotic insects and tree diseases. Please do not bring firewood from out-of-state locations.**

### for your safety

Do not invite raccoons, ducks or other wildlife to the beach or into the campground. Keep the park clean by disposing of food waste properly and securing all food items in your vehicle at night. Coolers left out are easily opened by hungry raccoons. Feeding the ducks attracts large numbers to the swimming area where they become a health concern.
